Seraiki is written in Shahmukhi (urdu) script,because no one in Pakistan can read Hindi script.Urdu press media uses urdu 'Nastaleeq' which is readable only in photo form on computers.Wasaib team has developed Seraiki unicode script for the first time which is a freeware and is available to members.It is in Nasakh as bbcurdu.Indeed gurmukhi script was used for writing seraiki before partition here.

Seraiki Deptments are working in Islamia Uni. Bahawalpur and BZ university Multan.

The authorities in Pakistan are reluctant to give Seraiki its right status.But a nation 50 million strong having thousands of years cultural heritage cannot be be supressed in this age, as we believe.
